Take your last look at the beautiful spring!


Sorrowful Spring leaves the beautiful woodlands, bright happy Summer begins her sweet reign.



ROAD TRIP







Inspection Trip of the Colorado River Aqueduct.

What a fantastic educational tour! About 35 of us began our adventure at 7 a.m. on a cool, almost chilly Friday morning in March at the Calleguas Municipal Water District, only a few scant miles north of Simi Valley and close by the Ronald Reagan Library. We enjoyed a tasty continental breakfast snack and were briefed by Director Ted Grandsen and the knowledge tour guide Patricia Chandler, we loaded into a comfortable coach and headed south for La Verne, California.

We arrived at the Weymouth Water Quality and Treatment Plant a few minutes after nine a.m. where experts gave us a detailed hour tour of the Lab, and then we marched to the Weymouth Maintenance Support Shops. It is a uniquely large 3 or 4 story facility with some of the larger lathes and milling machines in the world which are used to support the aqueduct. If you've watch some Steven Seagal Martial Arts movies you've probably seen the inside of the shop.

Then we loaded back on the coach and headed for the desert and to Lake Havasu. The driver skillfully brought us to Gene Village, the Metropolitan Water District [MWD] Desert Field Headquarters, where we were assigned our rooms. After squaring away our gear, we meet in the Club house for socializing and beverages. This gave us time to shower, stretch our legs and get to know each other a little more. Around 7, 7:30 we walked over to the Gene Mess Hall. My one concern, the food was absolutely delicious; they feed us to the brim. The staff was fabulous and we couldn't have asked for more.



The next morning we had roll call and breakfast in the Gene Mess Hall, again more food than we could handle. After breakfast we loaded into the bus and departed for Copper Basin Reservoir where we loaded into a large pontoon boat and took a tour of the lake and the main damn. We were allowed to stop at the damn and walk along the top and Tour Guide Pat gave us an interesting and detailed history of the damn and how the lake is used as a pumping reservoir for the lifting the water to the next pumping station to the Aqueduct. Later in the morning we toured the William P. Whitsett Pumping plant on Lake Havasu, which was another spotless and amazing facility to behold. Back to the Gene Mess Hall for a huge lunch and a presentation by Don





Kendall, CMWD General Manager then a tour through the Allan Preston Museum.

After that we enjoyed another afternoon a social hour, with plenty of snacks and beverages, then another sumptuous dinner at the Gene Mess Hall. Pat our tour guide filled us in on the history of the area, the major project of building the damn and the aqueduct starting back in the late 1920's, the lady is an amazing fountain of knowledge and her delivery is always catching and interesting..

Stuffed to the gills, we had no difficulty in falling asleep. The next morning a lighter breakfast at the Mess Hall and we headed out on a tour following the route of the aqueduct.
